'Fairhell' was the real name of Dr Blackbush. I have forgotten the 'black eye' incident. I think it was told to me in the 'Ladywell' pub.

'Wrangles' was Strangles, a nasty plain-clothes detective at 'Randsweil' station. S. went to prison in the 'twenties for forcing an old woman at Wither Green to make a will in his favour (I read in *The Daily Mail*). He went to prison. In the 'thirties I saw he was proprietor of a pub at Ware - fat, thick-toothed, blond.

'Fairhell' married a baker's daughter of Ladywell. Apparently his drinking habit got him into trouble - a child died & neglected - and someone set on him? Strangles - in a fog: black eye.

Blackbush's story should run through the book. Also Wrangles. There is blue-eyed Alice in the Castle - 17 - soft as sweet - loves Phillip (she resembles Helena Rodd) - tells hi.

Strangle seduced her as a skivvy (14) in the Rec., in 1913. She died. S. sees Alice with Phillip - attracted to her by her Helena-resemblance. This is 1916, after P's return from Gulf the First, wounded.
